Welcome

2024 was another tough year for young people experiencing or at risk of homelessness. While there were positive developments – making Universal Credit more equal – these gains were cancelled out by decisions such as increasing Employers' National Insurance and freezing Local Housing Allowance, which have squeezed young people and the services that support them even further.

Despite this, thousands of the young people we helped overcame terrible odds and blazed a path away from homelessness towards independence. Young people can and will thrive if they receive the right support at the right time; they are an asset that should be nurtured for everyone's benefit.

Previously, EveryYouth helped young people in homelessness services gain the confidence, skills and resources they needed to compete with their peers. In 2024 we added a new dimension, creating targeted opportunities.

Project Flourish reflects EveryYouth's collaborative DNA. Developed with Hays Plc, Project Flourish brings young people, the charities that support them and potential employers together. We help all stakeholders understand what support young people experiencing homelessness need to secure employment and remove practical barriers which are often overlooked.

We are now ready to scale this programme in partnership with Homewards, The Royal Foundation's campaign to end homelessness. A huge thanks goes to Hays and the employers giving young people a chance.

Positivity is core to Project Flourish and EveryYouth's work generally. The young people we support are unfortunate to be homeless but they are not defeated. I met 14 young people from across the UK at the most recent EveryYouth photoshoot (see p25) and the positivity was almost overwhelming. They weren't feeling sorry for themselves; they were excited about being in London, going on planes for the first time, seeing a glimpse behind the scenes of the media world. This is a lesson for us all.

If young people, faced by shocking odds, can find a way of being optimistic and excited about their futures, it is imperative society harnesses that energy and supports their endeavours. EveryYouth will not give up on young people. We implore policy makers, employers, and society at large to look beyond the word homeless. Start seeing a young person you have the power to help and do something about it.

The year in review

2024 was a year of mounting challenges for young people in the UK. Economic pressures, political uncertainty, a struggling job market, and a deepening mental health crisis created an environment where independence felt further out of reach than ever. The cost-of-living crisis continued to hit young people hard, with soaring rents, food prices, and energy costs making it nearly impossible for many to secure stable housing or plan for their future.

For some, these pressures meant being forced to remain in unsafe or unstable situations, trapped in cycles of insecurity with no clear way forward. Access to mental health support remained limited, making it even harder for young people to overcome the barriers in their way. And for those trying to enter the workforce, financial and systemic challenges meant that simply finding a job was not always enough to secure long-term independence.



It has never been clearer that EveryYouth is needed. Our programmes provide the practical and emotional support young people need to break through these barriers. Whether it's securing safe housing, accessing vital mental health services, or receiving the right support to enter employment, EveryYouth ensures that young people aren't defined by their circumstances—they are empowered to shape their own futures.

What we do

Last year, **118,134** young people faced homelessness (Centrepoint, 2025). Young people find themselves in this position through no fault of their own and lack the holistic support and opportunities they need to escape it.

We work to provide this support and unlock opportunities at scale by:

Funding Outcomes

We fund outcomes, which gives Delivery Partners the flexibility to deliver support in a way that's most effective for the young people they work with. This also helps us show EveryYouth's Backers the real impact of their support.

Building knowledge

We scale ideas that have been tried and tested regionally and we are committed to continuous learning. Our approach allows us to compare different ways of working and we are committed to collating and publishing that learning.

Creating Opportunities

We connect regional charities to learn from each other but also to businesses, community groups, academics and others to create opportunities for young people

Our **VISION** is a society where every youth is empowered to thrive.

Our **MISSION** is to create space and equitable opportunities for every youth to thrive.

In 2024, 1 in 6 young people not in employment, education or training reported mental ill health (APS, 2024). Long waits for support can delay progress into education, employment, or housing.

Launched in 2022, EveryYouth Healthy connects young people with specialist support within two weeks—offering 12 sessions on average, twice the NHS standard. This gives space to build trust, process trauma, and create lasting change.

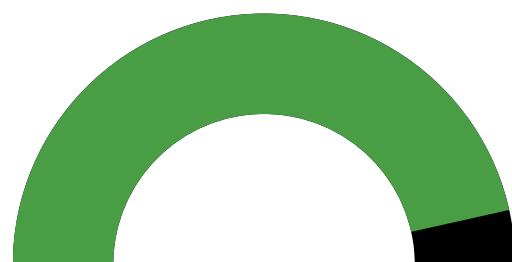
This year, we expanded our reach by partnering with Depaul UK. This expansion enabled **279 young people to receive mental health support.**

By prioritising mental health, we empower young people to overcome barriers and build independent futures.

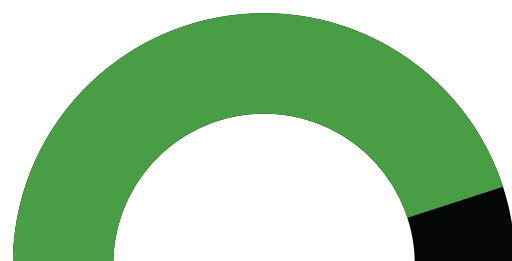

EVERYYOUTH EMPLOYED

The job market remains challenging for young people. By the end of 2024, nearly 1 in 7 were not in education, employment or training—a 14% rise from 2023—driven by declining job opportunities and the highest unemployment and inactivity rates since the pandemic. Many are locked out of work and unable to gain the experience needed for independence.

EveryYouth Employed tackles these barriers with one-to-one support from expert job coaches. In 2024, 557 young people moved into education, employment or training.

Traineeship completions more than doubled (up 123%) thanks to strong local partnerships, offering young people a stable route into work and a path away from insecure, low-paid jobs towards a brighter future.

Employability Boost

The Employability Boost is a central feature of EveryYouth Employed. This bursary scheme helps young people overcome the costs associated with getting into work and education. Whether a young person needs help with course fees or the bus fare to a job interview, we make sure small financial barriers don't prevent young people securing long-term independence.

There was a total of **585 Boosts awarded to 497 young people**. A key driver was the 66% rise in young people receiving support to enter employment. With inflation pushing up the cost of essential items, more young people than ever are struggling to afford the basics needed to access employment.

Project Flourish

In partnership with Hays, **Project Flourish** supports young people at risk of homelessness into meaningful employment.



By combining Hays' recruitment expertise with EveryYouth's youth support network, the project offers tailored online learning, inclusive job opportunities, and wraparound support — including workplace mentoring and Super Boosts (bursaries).

Super Boosts go a step further than the Employability Boost. They are larger grants - up to £2,050 - which are designed to support young people with the multiple hurdles that prevent them entering or sustaining employment. A Super Boost enables long-term independence where smaller interventions aren't enough.

Together, we're setting young people up for long-term success and continually improving outcomes through ongoing support and evaluation.

EVERYYOUTH

HOMED

In 2024, rising rents and the refreezing of Local Housing Allowance created even greater barriers to stable housing. These pressures are expected to push thousands further into poverty and make it even harder for young people to find a safe place to call home.

Through EveryYouth Homed, we supported young people to find and maintain tenancies. **255 young people moved into independent living** with one-to-one support from specialist Housing Officers.

To help turn a house into a home, we also provided **150 Move-On Grants** for essentials like kitchen appliances, white goods and bedding.

Future Builders

Future Builders provides affordable housing for young people in education, employment, or training, enabling them to live independently and break the cycle of homelessness. In partnership with local authorities, housing associations, and private landlords, the programme secures long-term leases on underused properties, refurbished with support from foundations and businesses.

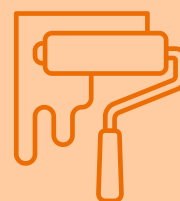
In 2024, with backing from John Laing Charitable Trust and the B&Q Foundation, the EveryYouth Network expanded Future Builders by nearly 22%, creating 10 new bedspaces.

Of those young people who moved on from Future Builders, **70%** went onto independent living

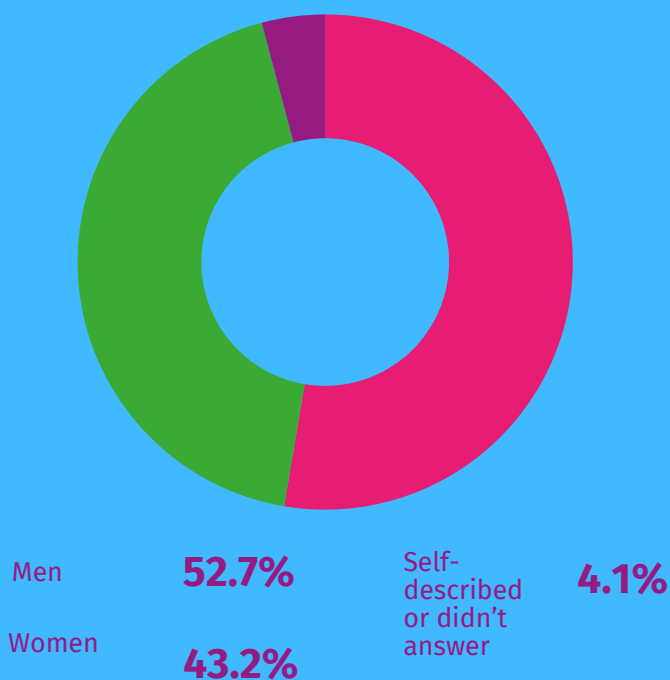

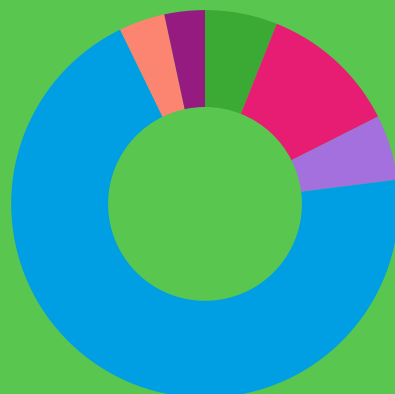

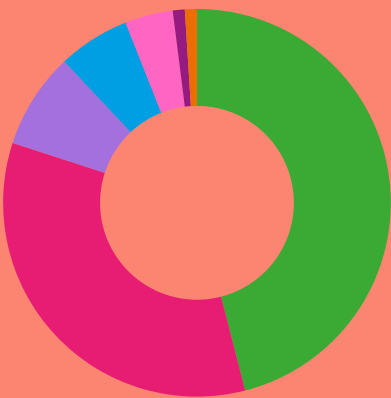

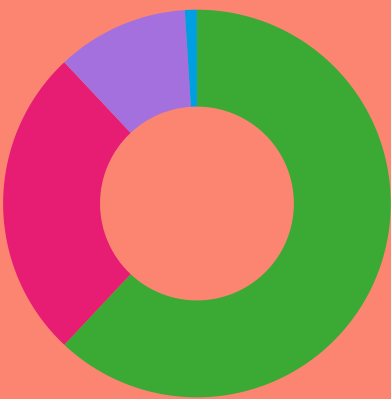
